I'm really happy to share and perserve art through this.



Artists I admire and Inspirations...

A lot of the things I draw are centred primarily around mecha and scifi anime series from the 70s and 80s. The texture of hand drawn, on paper and cel-animation that wasn't as concerned with perfection of the lines was always something that I was mesmerized by. I could go on and on about what I love from that era, but I'm going to keep it short and more focused on the things I'm more inspired to emulate.

Prolific designer and illustrator, Hirotoshi Sano's twitter doodles, with their simple lines and minimal shading, speak to me and urge me to try to practice on this type of swiftness. His mechanical drawing and watercolour illustrations is truly my dream (delusional) end goal.

Another big inspiration is the works of Leiji Matsumoto. They have left their mark in my early adulthood and still resonate with me to this day. The use of negative space, minimalistic but


iconic designs and romantic tendencies are things that are associated with their art style. I would specifically like to mention Keisuke Masunaga's illustrations and character designs for the Leiji Matsumoto series that were produced in the 2000s. They stand out for their thick outlines and shadows, bringing a new look but still maintaining the aura of the old designs. Yoshinori Kanada. The expressive and explosive body language on his key frames and the seemingly effortlessness of his mechanical drawings leave me awe-stricken. 
