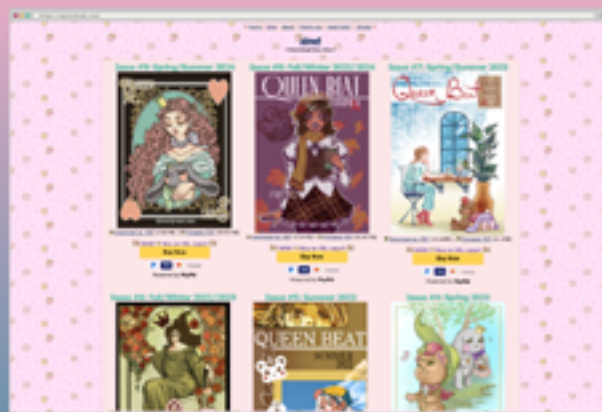

I use PENUP, and I love how easy it is to undo, erase, and play with vector lines. You can layer things, add backgrounds, and just make something fun and weird in a few taps.

Growing up, I was one of those kids who would draw or trace something then immediately crumple it up if my mom walked in. I wasn't shy exactly, just kinda private about it — I don't even know why. Looking back, I really wish I hadn't done that. I wish I had kept a binder or something, just to see how far I'd come.

I've been working with kids for about 8 years now, and one of my favorite things is encouraging them to keep their art. I love watching what they create, even the messy or silly stuff. I always encourage them to keep it — every doodle matters, because that's how you see your growth over time. I try to give them the kind of support I wish I'd given myself.

I haven't had the time to go deep with my own art yet — most of it's quick little bursts when I'm stuck in limbo at work or out running around. One day, I'd love to take a class and really sit with something longer, more intentional.

I'm really happy to share and persevere art through this.

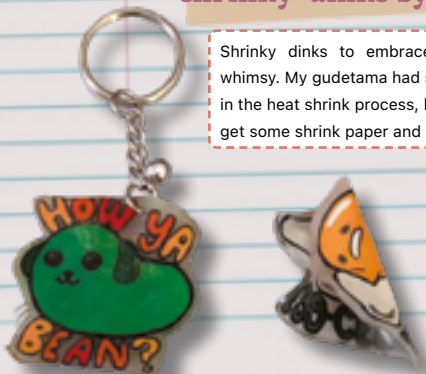

I followed the pattern "Botanical Yoke Dog Sweater" by Sole Salvo (<https://www.ravelry.com/patterns/library/botanical-yoke-dog-sweater>) and used Stylecraft's Highland Heathers yarn in DK weight and colour 'Salmon'. I loved how the sweater looked in the pictures on Ravelry and it seemed like a challenging knit for me, as I am quite new to knitting. I wasn't knitting all the time, just before bed or during breaks at work, so it took me about a year to finish it - including gaps where I would be too busy with other projects to knit.

It was the first 'garment' I'd ever knitted, and I'm really pleased with how it turned out! It fits her really well and I love how the sweater's neck and sleeves can be rolled up or down. I would recommend this pattern if you have a lovely four legged friend who needs a warm sweater, or if you are new to knitting and want to have a try at using needles, ribbing, cables, and attaching sleeves.

Why I started drawing...

When I was a kid/teenager drawing in front of the TV, using references from fashion magazines was one of my favourite past time activities. When I was around 17 I took the freehand and technical drawing classes that my high school offered. After this stage of my life, drawing was a hobby that I abandoned. Many years later I was inspired to revisit it again. I had already been an avid fan of animation and especially enamoured with mecha anime.

Mecha anime has been a big part of my adult life and my appreciation for the genre has been building up for over 10 years now. Although, I would consider myself well versed in mecha, for

a long time I had certain blind spots. Around January of 2024 I decided to delve into the super robot genre. I decided to watch the *Mazinkaiser 2000* OVA and, besides finally visiting the origins of mecha, this anime sparked the need to create something myself. Mazinkaiser is truly an impressive work of animation, made with such love and energy that never fails to inspire and awaken the fire in your heart. By February I started doodling. At first I was redrawing anime screenshots of my favourite series, then started practising in a more systematic manner and currently I'm trying to work more on photograph studies.

My initial goals might have been to learn how to draw robots but I found the task to be extremely difficult. While it brought me a new appreciation for mechanical designers and animators, it also made me refocus my efforts in other subjects. Eventually I did find myself really enjoying drawing faces and expression but the dream of being able to draw robots has not been abandoned and I will revisit it when my skills improve. I do not consider myself particularly skilled at this point but I certainly enjoy the process more than the end result. I might be progressing slowly but I am progressing and that's all that matters to me. I might be making "bad art" but I am having fun.

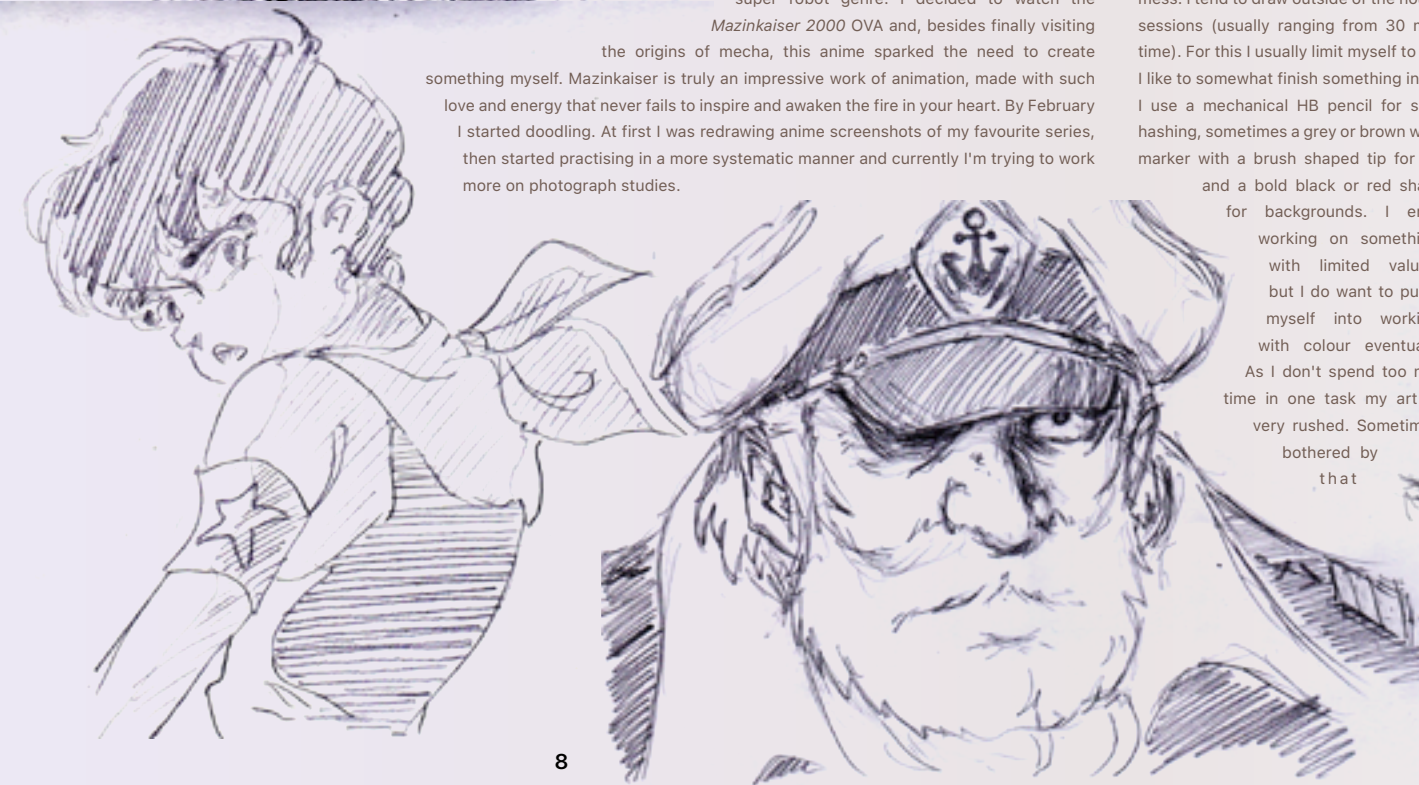
The past 6 months drawing has been a valuable mental anchor. The increasing sense of doom, caused by current events, and the impulse to isolate, resulting from the state discourse that is slipping into aspects of real life interactions, have been opposed by this newfound zest for life that this hobby is making me feel. Spending a few hours per week scribbling lines on a piece of paper has become my most calming and spirit cleansing activity. It has made me withstand

and confront situations with more intense levels of confidence and tenacity. It might feel banal and silly but there is a lot of truth when people say that in desperate situations making art is what can keep you sane. I would encourage anyone to make art, no matter how amateur you might think you are.

What I use to draw...

I keep it cheap, easy to carry and not causing too much mess. I tend to draw outside of the house, in time restrained sessions (usually ranging from 30 min to 2 hours at a time). For this I usually limit myself to rough sketches as I like to somewhat finish something in the time I have.

I use a mechanical HB pencil for sketching and hashing, sometimes a grey or brown water based marker with a brush shaped tip for shading and a bold black or red sharpies for backgrounds. I enjoy working on something with limited values but I do want to push myself into working with colour eventually. As I don't spend too much time in one task my art looks very rushed. Sometimes I am bothered by that



but other times I recognize that it has increased my speed and the lines have been getting steadier with time, so I'm not too discouraged.

Artists I admire and Inspirations...

A lot of the things I draw are centred primarily around mecha and scifi anime series from the 70s and 80s. The texture of hand drawn, on paper and cel-animation that wasn't as concerned with perfection of the lines was always something that I was mesmerized by. I could go on and on about what I love from that era, but I'm going to keep it short and more focused on the things I'm more inspired to emulate.

Prolific designer and illustrator, **Hirotooshi Sano's** twitter doodles, with their simple lines and minimal shading, speak to me and urge me to try to practice on this type of swiftness. His mechanical drawing and watercolour illustrations is truly my dream (delusional) end goal.

Another big inspiration is the works of **Leiji Matsumoto**. They have left their mark in my early adulthood and still resonate with me to this day. The use of negative space, minimalistic but iconic designs and romantic tendencies are things that are associated with their art style. I would specifically like to mention **Keisuke Masunaga's** illustrations and character designs for the Leiji Matsumoto series that were produced in the 2000s. They stand out for their thick outlines and shadows, bringing a new look but still maintaining the aura of the old designs.

Yoshinori Kanada. A great figure in the word of animation and obviously I wouldn't be unaffected by his talent. The expressive and explosive body language on his key frames and the seemingly effortlessness of his mechanical drawings leave me awe-stricken. He has animated some of my favourite sequences in anime and his collaboration with director **Rintaro** in the adaptation of Leiji Matsumoto titles, along with his work on *Space Battleship Yamato* hit an overlap of personal interests.

The *Patlabor* franchise and **Masami Yuuki**. As much as I enjoy insane super robots, ethereal space entities and romantic storylines I

also enjoy grounded and realistic procedurals and political thrillers. *Patlabor* happens to have robots in them too. One of the most me-core collection of media out there. Witty, funny, introspective and multifaceted it left its mark on the mecha genre. It is my go to when I want to practice on more realistic subjects. Specifically the manga drawn by Masami Yuuki is a goldmine of references. Anatomy, perspective, dynamic poses, clothes, uniforms, weapons, buildings, backgrounds, mechs... It is a masterfully consistent manga in terms of art style that exhibits a variety of material.

Current obsession, **Yoji Shinkawa's** illustrations. At the date I'm writing this, the past couple months my existence has been consumed by Metal Gear Solid to a degree I didn't think was possible. I am no gamer but I devoured all the cinematics in the span of a month and my life has not been the same since. Honestly it is incredible when you find something to be the best thing ever in a stage of your life after adolescence. It is a priceless feeling and should be cherished. It even pushed me into learning Russian! Unbelievable. Anyway, naturally, I would be impressed by Shinkawa's art on the Metal Gear Solid character sheets and illustrations. It's the single-stroke-like use of the brush, the limited values, the heavy shadows, the composition, the way the eyes are drawn...I think it's time I get into ink...
